#### **Q&A with Lily**



Q: What is Urglaawe?

A: Urglaawe is a religion based on Pennsylvania German lore. Lore is another word for traditions and stories.

Q: Does it have some super secret language?

A: It's not a secret, but Deitsch is an important language in Urglaawe. It is a unique dialect related to German that is still spoken in parts of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland and other parts of the East Coast. Not many people speak it, so if you learn it - it might feel like a secret language!



Q: Is there a Holiday?

A: There are 8 major holidays in Urglaawe, some of which are 12 days long! There are also many smaller holidays.

Q: Is it a culture?

A: Urglaawe is not yet its own culture, but it is part of the larger culture of the Pennsylvania Germans, or Deitsch.

# II. Make Your Own Bubbles

- 1. Pour 1 cup of water into a jar or bowl.
- 2. Add 1 tablespoon of dish soap.
- 3. Add 1 tablespoon of glycerine.
- 4. Stir ingredients. If bubbles don't form well, add a bit more soap or glycerine.



## III. Make A Magic Potion

- With an adult, collect flower petals, leaves and berries.
  Be careful, some plants can cause a rash when they touch your skin.
- 2. Use a mortar and pestle to grind up your finds.
- 3. Mix with water and put in a pretty jar. Use it to water extra special plants and flowers!



## IV. Dye Eggs with Onions

- 1. Fill a stainless steel pot with red onion peels and water.
- 2. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low and simmer the peels for 15 minutes. Then leave to cool for 24 hours.
- 3. Bring the onion peels and water to a boil again.
- 4. Wrap herbs or flowers that might make nice patterns around room temperature eggs and gently place inside a nylon stocking. Tie the ends to secure the stocking.



5. Fully submerge the eggs and boil for 7-8 minutes. Then shock with ice water.

Zusaagpflicht: noun

The Zusaagpflicht is the equivalent of frith towards non-human people, a Sacred Duty, or Sacred Promise that all of us can work towards. As every living thing thrives, so do we. Another part of the Zusaagpflicht is honoring the sacrifice that plants, animals, and other living things make - so that they, and we, may survive and thrive.
